Background:

The Centre for Judicial Education and Research (CJER) is a research centre established by City University of Hong Kong to conduct judicial training of incumbent Chinese Judges. The EU-China Legal and Judicial Cooperation (EUPLANT) is a Jean Monnet Network that investigates the interactions between the Chinese and the European Union (EU) legal system. China has initiated multiple rounds of judicial reform since 1999. The interaction between the Chinese and the EU legal and judicial systems has become an important aspect of EU-China collaboration, both in the practices of judicial cooperation, and inspirations on China's legal reform into the new era.

The objectives of conference are to:

- Bring scholars as well as judges from Europe, Asia and China (including Hong Kong) together to discuss key issues in China's current round of judicial reform and EU-China judicial cooperation;
- Engender a better understanding of each other's legal systems;
- Provide critical academic assessment for the current reform in China and propose suggestions for future reforms.
