We would like to inform you that three newly installed EV charging stations (32A) will be ready for use with effect from 1 September 2018 (Saturday). Two of them are located in YEUNG carpark (parking spaces no. 70 and 71, near CYC) and one in BOC carpark (parking space no. 58). Kindly note that the existing four 13A slow charging stations will cease service on 1 October 2018.

The new EV charging stations are operated by a service provider, Hong Kong EV Power Co. Ltd. Staff and students who want to use the EV charging service are required to apply for memberships in advance with the service provider. Account users can use the charging service conveniently by means of mobile apps and RFID cards.

[CAP] (Reminder) Energy Saving Charter 2019 - Energy Saving Tips on Control of Indoor Temperature

Dear All.

Earlier in May 2019, the University has signed up to the Energy Saving Charter 2019 ("Charter") which is co-launched by Environmental Bureau and Electrical and Mechanical Services Department. By signing the Charter, the University is committed to maintain an average indoor temperature between 24-26°C during the summer months of June to September in 2019.

Your support is essential for the University to fulfill this commitment. Here are a few energy saving tips for control of indoor temperature:

- Keep all the windows and doors closed when air-conditioner is running.
- Keep doors between air-conditioned and non-air-conditioned areas such as those connecting the outside of the building, lift lobbies, toilets and stores shut so as to minimize air infiltration when the air-conditioner is operating.
- Keep door of fridge closed.
- Avoid setting the thermostat at a colder setting than normal when you turn on your air conditioner. It will not cool
 the room any faster but could result in excessive power consumption.
- Turn on the ceiling fans if installed in classrooms. Fans cool people by creating a wind chill effect. Turn them off when you leave the room.

For this campaign, all caterers on campus are requested to:


- not putting straws at free access counters; and

To further extend the determination to develop a green and healthy community by reducing waste at source, the Joint-U Campaign 2019 - UNIfy: BYO (八大BYO) will be officially launched on 11 March 2019 to engage campus community members to take BYO ("Bring Your Own") actions to reduce disposable waste by bringing their own reusable (water bottles, cups, food containers, cutlery, bags etc.) as to meet their needs and own preference.

The campaign signifies the joint efforts of City University of Hong Kong, The Education University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong Baptist University, The Hong Kong Polytechnic University, Lingnan University, Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, The Chinese University of Hong Kong, and The University of Hong Kong.

CityU will extend the campaign to a "BYO @ CityU" starting from 11 March till 10 April 2019. During the period, catering outlets on campus will offer the incentives as follows:

As a continuing effort in reducing disposables from restaurants, the University has signed the "Zero Dine-in Disposable Utensils Charter" (Charter) organized by Green Sense. The restaurants on campus joining the Charter are:

- City Express
- AC2 Canteen
- AC3 Bistro
- City Chinese Restaurant
- City Top

By signing the Charter, the University and the restaurants are committed to the following:

- Avoiding the distribution of disposable utensils to dine-in customers
- Refraining from providing disposable items to the customers, such as plastic straws, paper tray-liners, plastic stirring sticks, etc.
- Using washable utensils and containers within the dine-in area
- Encouraging customers to bring their own utensils, offering discounts if possible
- Considering cooperation with dish-washing companies if there is a lack of scullery facilities

Through providing less disposables and enhancing sustainability considerations in operations, we hope that every member of the CityU Community can produce less waste by using no disposables.





Lai See Packets Recycling

FW: [CAP] IoT (Internet of Things) RVMs (Reverse Vending Machines) for PET Plastic Bottles Recycling

Dear Colleagues and Students,

As a step towards CityU's commitment for a bottled water-free campus, two units of IoT (Internet of Things) RVMs (Reverse Vending Machine) have been installed at the following locations to collect spent PET plastic bottles for recycling:

- 1. Outside City Express, 5/F, Bank of China (Hong Kong) Complex;
- 2. Common area near Security Room, G/F, Li Dak Sum Yip Yio Chin Academic Building.

The campaign aims to lead an increase on the recycle of PET bottles at campus through innovative loT RVMs and to raise the awareness of our colleagues and students on sustainability.

Being technology-driven, the RVM uses a barcode scanner to sort out PET bottles for recycling. The quantity of waste inside the machine is monitored by a telemetry system and would generate a signal to back office for collection of the spent PET bottles to certified recyclers. In this way, the spent PET bottles will be properly handled and not be sent to landfill.

To encourage users for recycling, virtual coins will be awarded for each transaction and they can be used for discounts, donations, etc. Details of the incentive programme will be provided later.

Dear Colleagues and Students,

You may have noticed that two units IoT (Internet of Things) RVMs (Reverse Vending Machine) have been installed at YEUNG (outside City Express) and LI (Common area on G/F near Security Room) to collect spent PET plastic bottles for recycling. The campaign aims to lead an increase on the recycle of PET bottles at campus through innovative IoT RVMs and to raise the awareness of our colleagues and students on sustainability.

Thanks to the exuberant response from the CityU community, over 1,300 PET bottles have been collected in such a short period.

In the coming weeks, Vitasoy will install a Smart Vending Machine ("Vsmart") at LI (next to the RVM) for redemption of the following incentives for every 30 PET bottles recycled at the RVMs:

- 1. Get a free PET drink (valued at \$7.5) from Vitasov at the Smart Vending Machine; or
- 2. Give a donation of \$7.5 via Vitasoy to St. James' Settlement.

As a token of thanks to CityU community members who support the campaign so wholeheartedly, there is an "Early Bird Offer" for each registered participant to enjoy the above incentive with just 20 PET bottles recycled. Each registered participant is entitled to the offer once and all PET bottles recycled at the RVMs on or before 31 March 2019 are included.

More Smart Vending Machines will be installed on campus later in the year.






