Join Business Competitions to Kickstart Your Career

I think joining the business competitions is one of the critical elements for building your future career, especially if you are a junior, you may chance to meet and interact with representatives from different corporates, while those experiences allow you to demonstrate your passion for working in particular industries or job positions to your future employers.

KPMG Business Administration (BA) Paper was one of the business case competitions that I joined in 2019 and successfully became the semi-finalist. This competition is one of the largest international business plan writing competitions annually organised by the Hong Kong Federation of Business Students. This year's theme was "Risk Transformer", so my team used a virtual banking case study to predict and analyse several future business risks in the Hong Kong business market, after which we presented a report to a group of judges. This experience instilled in me the value of effective teamwork while helping me showcase my critical thinking skills as well as boosting my financial knowledge.

LinkedIn is Your Good Friend

Once you have set up your profile on LinkedIn, you can receive notifications on recommendation jobs based on your preferences, so it saves your time in searching for new jobs on the internet.
