

Latest Human Swine Flu (Influenza A/H1N1) Cases (Update)

The following table outlines the confirmed cases of Human Swine Flu (Influenza A/H1N1) in which the affected person is known to have taken part in activities on CityU campus, or University activities outside the campus.

Date	Brief
29 September 2009	A Year 2 BBA Management Science student has been confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1. He is not a student resident and he did not require hospitalisation.
28 September 2009	A nurse from the Medical Clinic has been confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1 on 27 September. She did not require hospitalisation.
23 September 2009	SCOPE reported that a top-up BBA student from Macquarie University has been confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1 on 21 September. He required hospitalisation and last attended class on 18 September.
21 September 2009	The Department of Electronics and Engineering reported that a PhD student has been confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1. She is not a student resident.
15 September 2009	A Year 1 AD Applied Chinese Studies student, who last attended the Kowloon Tong Campus on 11 September, has been confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1.
9 September 2009	A mainland student from BSocSc Policy Studies & Admin (2007 cohort) who lives in the Student Residence has been confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1. He is now staying in a single Emergency Room in his hall.
9 September 2009	An on-site computing firm engineer who mainly takes care of servers and stations at CSC, and a student of ABA(Accountancy), who last attended classes on 31 August, have been confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1.
8 September 2009	A student from ASc Surveying has been confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1 after participating in the Astronomy Society O'camp (5-6 Sep) and the BC Soc O'camp (28-30 Aug). The student was not hospitalised.
7 September 2009	A BSc Computer Science student (2008 cohort) has been confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1. She is

	not a CityU resident.
4 September 2009	A Year 1 student from the Department of Media and Communication, who participated in the EN Society O'camp (27-29/August) has been confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. She was discharged from hospital after staying there for two days. She is not a CityU resident and has not attended any classes so far.
4 September 2009	An academic staff member from CCCU who teaches Pre-AD programmes at the CCCU Mongkok Centre (Pioneer Centre) and a non-academic staff member from SCOPE, whose office is in the Jockey Club Environmental Building, have been confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. Neither has been hospitalised.
3 September 2009	A PhD student from the Department of Chinese, Translation and Linguistics, who is a Residence Tutor and non-local student, has been confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. He is resting at his residence.
31 August 2009	Student Development Services reported that three participants of the Mathematics Society O'Camp (19-21 August) have been confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. They are BSc Computing Mathematics students.
31 August 2009	A Year 2 student of ASc Surveying and a clerical officer from the School of Graduate Studies were confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1 on 29 August. The student was asked to stay at home and had not participated in any O'camp beforehand. The staff member last worked in the office on 27 August.
28 August 2009	The School of Law reported that two students were confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. They are among the students from East China University of Politics and Law taking courses offered by the LLB Programme. They arrived in Hong Kong on 23 August and are now staying at residences provided by SLW in Hung Hum.
28 August 2009	The Student Development Services reported that a BSc Applied Biology student has been confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1 some days before she participated in the Biology and Chemistry Society O'camp (25-27 Aug). She developed fever on the evening of 26 Aug

	in the camp and was then admitted to hospital.
28 August 2009	The Student Development Services reported that 46 students participating in the Students' Union Orientation Camp held at Po Leung Kuk Pak Tam Chung Holiday Camp during 13 - 15 August were confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1 and are now staying at home.
26 August 2009	Student Development Services reported that three more students who attended the Applied Social Studies Society (11-13 August) have been confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. They include a BSocScAS Year 2 student who is not a hall resident and was not hospitalised; a BSocScAS Year 3 student who is a hall resident and was not hospitalised; and a BSocSc Criminology Year 3 student who is a hall resident and was not hospitalised.
26 August 2009	Student Development Services reported that two other students have been confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1. The students (BSCCM Year 2 and BACM Year 1) are not hall residents and were not hospitalised
24 August 2009	The Education Development Office reported this morning that a student helper has been confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. She has not been hospitalised. She is a Year 3 BA Creative Media student and not a CityU resident. She last worked in the office on 21 August and attended the Students' Union O'Camp (13-15 August) as photographer.
24 August 2009	Three students have been confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. They are a BSocSc Applied Sociology student who attended the SS O'camp held on 11-13 August and is not a CityU resident; a BBA Marketing student who is a student resident; and a BEng e-Longistics and Technology Management student who is also a student resident.
21 August 2009	The Student Development Services reported that two participants of the Marketing Society O'Camp (17-19 August) have been confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. They are BBA Marketing year 2 and ABA Marketing year 1 students and are not CityU residents. They are now staying at home.

20 August 2009	The Library reported that two student helpers have been confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. One last worked at the Library on 14 August and the other did not work last week. They also participated in the Accountancy Society O'Camp. They are not CityU residents.
19 August 2009	The Department of Manufacturing Engineering & Engineering Management reported that a year 3 student of BEng Industrial Engineering and Engineering Management has been confirmed to have contracted influenza A/H1N1 today. She has not been hospitalized. She last attended group project work in their departmental lab last Friday and visited the SU O'Camp during 13-15 August. The lab has been disinfected and the lab staff and her group members have been informed about the case.
19 August 2009	The Student Development Services reported that 2 students of the Department of Accountancy and Division of Commerce, who participated in the Accountancy Society O'Camp during 15-17 August, have been confirmed to have contracted influenza A/H1N1. The students are now staying at home.
18 August 2009	The Division of Building Science and Technology reported today that a year 2 student of Associate of Science in Architectural Studies was confirmed to have contracted influenza A/H1N1 on 16 Aug and is now under medical treatment in the Tuen Mun Hospital. The student does not live at the students residence at CityU. He did not participate in any scheduled activities at CityU last week.
14 August 2009	The Student Development Services reported that a group leader of the Orientation Camp of the Society of Investment and Financial was confirmed on 13 August to have contracted Influenza A(H1N1) and is now staying at home. The camp was held during 9-11 August at the Po Leung Kuk Pak Tam Chung Holiday Camp. He visited the University Health Centre after the camp on 11 August and was referred to the designated flu clinic. The student is a Year 3 student of BBA Business Economics and is not a CityU resident.
12 August 2009	A research assistant from the Office of the Provost, who is also a Residence Tutor of the Student Residence, was

	<p>confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1 this afternoon. She last appeared in the office on August 12. Disinfection of her work place at Festival Walk and the affected area at the Student Residence has been arranged. Neighbouring offices and residents of the Student Residence were being informed of the case.</p>
10 August 2009	<p>The Department of Management Sciences reported that one of their full-time temporary student assistants was confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1 on 8 August and is now staying at home. She last worked at the office on 7 August. Disinfection of her office and notification of the case to colleagues of the department have been arranged.</p>
7 August 2009	<p>The Department of Biology and Chemistry reported that a student of BSc Applied Biology has contracted Influenza A/H1N1 and is now recovering at home. She last attended class in the third week of July.</p>
7 August 2009	<p>The School of Graduate Studies reported that one of their staff was confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1 and is now at home. She was in the office until 5 August before starting her sick leave. The School will continue to provide regular services during normal office hours. Staff have been advised to wear a mask during work hours and when receiving students/visitors.</p>
6 August 2009	<p>The Department of Electronic Engineering reported that an Assistant Professor contracted Influenza A/H1N1 and is now staying at home. He had no classes within the past week but was last seen in his department on 4 August. Disinfection of his office was carried out.</p>
5 August 2009	<p>The Department of Accountancy reported that a student in Accountancy and Law was confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. She last attended class on 29 July. She is not a CityU resident.</p>
23 July 2009	<p>The Department of Chinese, Translation and Linguistics reported that a full-time student was confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1. The student attended a class (CTL3347) on the evening of 22 July at G4702, and is now staying at home.</p>

23 July 2009	A second local short-stay resident visitor participating in an international youth conference in Alumni Civility Hall (Hall 3) was confirmed to have contracted Influenza A/H1N1. All participants of the group have checked out the Student Residence.
20 July 2009	A short-stay resident visitor participating in an international youth conference in Alumni Civility Hall (Hall 3) was confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1.
13 June 2009	The Department of Accountancy reported that a participant of their summer conversion programme held on campus was confirmed as having contracted Influenza A/H1N1. The classrooms involved were LT-3, LT-4, LT-17 and B4302, B5210, G4302, G5216, P4302, P2631, P2633 and Y4302.

The University has undertaken a comprehensive cleaning and disinfecting of the affected areas and, where possible and appropriate, informed those who may have had contact with the infected persons.

We again take this opportunity to remind you of the important **Preventive measures** that can be adopted by all staff and students:

- keep hands clean and wash hands frequently with soap and water or apply alcohol-based hand cleaners,
- avoid touching eyes, nose or mouth,
- cover nose and mouth when sneezing or coughing,
- do not spit and always wrap nasal and mouth discharges with tissue paper, and dispose of the tissue paper properly in a lidded rubbish bin,
- wear mask when symptoms of respiratory tract infection or fever develop, and seek medical advice promptly; and
- refrain from work or school if symptoms develop.
