Take the MTR to Kowloon Tong Station and exit at exit A2

- a. Find Shop LG1-10, take the escalator next to it, which brings you to a pedestrian subway leading to CityU.
- b. Pass through the pedestrian subway and turn right to reach the Chinese Garden.
- c. Walk through the Chinese Garden and you will see University Circle and the Academic 3 building in front of you.
