

Chapter 7: Using Westlaw on iPad

Following on from using Lexis Nexis this chapter will cover using Westlaw on the iPad. As with Lexis Nexis you can log in exactly the same way as you would normally, i.e. NORA → Browse Resources by Subject → Law → Westlaw.

Step 1: Once Westlaw is loaded and document has been found






Unfortunately if you wish to read the document in Westlaw you cannot use the “Document” scroll mode in the top right of the picture above (larger version directly below), you must select the “Page” mode underlined in read below.



If you select to view the document in the “Page” scroll mod on the iPad it will appear as below and the document will appear on a single page.




Unlike Lexis Nexis, if you wish to view and save the document in iBooks you cannot simply click the “Save” button which is found in the upper right hand corner of the page above the “Scroll” options:



Step 2: Emailing the Westlaw Document to yourself

You will be able to access any documents found in Westlaw providing that you select to email the documents to yourself as opposed to saving the document. In order to do this you must click the “E-mail” link as set out above and this will then take you to the following screen:




Once you have entered your own details into "To" box and created a subject of your choice you can select either a Word/RTF file or a PDF. Once you have chosen PDF (for iBooks) then the email will be dispatched to your inbox.

Task 3: Inputting the document from your email inbox to iBooks


Once you have opened the your email folder on your iPad and selected the document sent from Westlaw the screen should appear identical or very similar to the one below:



After you have tapped on the PDF to open the file the document will open, once this occurs you will need to tap the top of the document once in order to see the menu bar at the top of it:



The next step is to tap the arrow in the top corner of the screen which will display the following options:



At this point you will need to select open in iBooks, and once this has been done you will need to follow the steps as described in the previous chapter (see pages...) so that you can store the document as you wish and can access it at any time.
