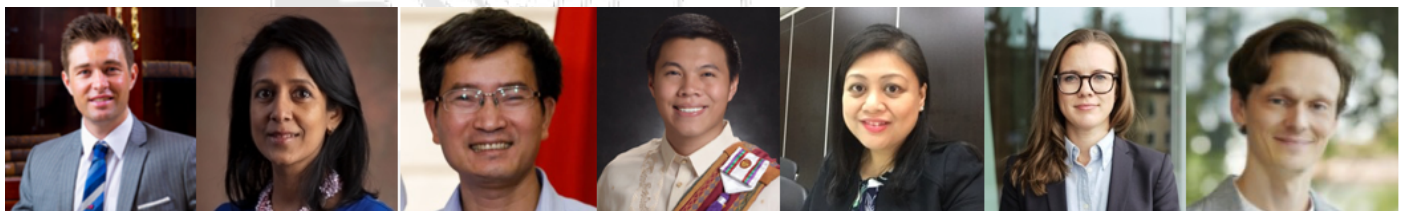
Defining and Defending the Rule of Law in Asia

CPLR Webinar Series on Asian Perspectives on Human Rights

The amount of ink that has been dedicated to issues concerning the rule of law around the world cannot be overstated. The rule of law has been examined from, inter alia, philosophical perspectives, focusing on the definition of the rule of law (e.g. in its thin and thick conceptions), historical perspectives (e.g. the development of the rule of law in common law and civil law traditions) and the extent to which different societies maintain the rule of law. In many jurisdictions, along with the associated terms 'human rights' and 'democracy', the rule of law has even attained the status as a 'master narrative' to which political actors of all stripes are invested. Nevertheless, critics assert that the 'rule of law' is under increasing threat in East and Southeast Asia, criticism that extends to jurisdictions such as Hong Kong, Cambodia, Myanmar and the Philippines, just to name a few.

This 90-minute online seminar aims to consider the definition and protection of the 'rule of law' in the Asian context, focusing specifically on the sub regions of East and Southeast Asia. Scholars working on these jurisdictions will discuss the following questions:

- What does the public in your jurisdiction associate with the term 'rule of law'?
- How is the 'rule of law' defined by lawyers, politicians and civil society in your jurisdiction? Is this different from its definition(s) popular within academic scholarship?
- Is there an 'Asian rule of law'?
- What are the challenges to the rule of law in East and Southeast Asia? How can the rule of law be better defended in these regions?
- What role do universities have to play in strengthening the rule of law?
